Definitely the reviewers will take special interests in doing an extensive review in a relatively shorter period with this. But at the same time, having a processing fee or publication fee may discourage many of the researchers in publishing their findings. Most of the authors from the developing countries would like to get their work published free of cost and they might look for journals that publish their articles free of cost. I welcome your idea of waiving the fee for the authors of poor countries and for those who are not financially supported by the institutions. Actually for a case report, ideal to have four authors as a maximum number. This will prevent unnecessary credit given to those who are really not involved in the study.
