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The prevalence of borderline mental Pathology among adolescent students during the period of distance learning. The role of the school nurse in primary and secondary Psych prophylaxis.



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ABSTRACT

The aim of this study was to study the prevalence rates of borderline mental pathology in medical college students in the context of distance learning. Research methods are clinical, epidemiological and hygienic. In 2021, 159 adolescents were examined - students of the 10th grade of the medical preuniversity in Moscow, at the age of 15-16 years. When analyzing the results of the data obtained, borderline mental deviations of varying severity were identified in 65.5% of all examined. The findings were compared with a similar study from 2020. A significant increase in neurotic disorders was revealed. It should be noted that syndromic-outlined neurotic states occurred in the surveyed contingent with a fairly high frequency - 13.2%, while none of the surveyed had previously been consulted by a specialist doctor. The conclusion is drawn about the extremely low appealability of adolescents and their parents to specialist psychiatrists and the exceptional role of the school nurse in the organization of primary and secondary psychoprophylaxis.
